

Annual Membership Plan

Suggested Monthly Action Items for Pack Growth Coordinators

2006-2007

- Responsibilities:
1. With other pack leadership, attend the District Fall Membership Orientation.
 2. Maintain and develop relationships with your School. Identify a parent from each grade level to communicate joining information to prospective parents.
 3. Conduct a year-round Cub Scout recruitment program.
 4. Attend the tentative Council or District Pack Growth recruitment program.
 5. Using resources, assist with a year-round membership growth plan by distributing promotional flyers, use yard signs, posters, newsletters articles, etc about your Cub Scout Pack, etc throughout the school year.

August

- Set pack membership goals through growth planning conference with Membership Coordinator, Cubmaster, and Committee Chairman.
- Secure fall membership night date for your pack.
- Follow-up with unregistered youth from advancement reports and activity rosters.
- Attend the District Fall Roundup Training.
- Work with parents and Pack leadership to promote and conduct a successful Cub Scout Fall Membership Night which includes the following:
 - Identify appropriate methods of invitation (flyers, stickers, posters, yard signs, boy talks, etc)
 - Identify a list of boys and families that are not involved in scouting and invite them to join
 - Prepare and provide manpower for an attractive Pack promotion table for School Open House
 - Work with parents at each grade level to promote Scouting to other parents
 - Develop a Cub Scout recruiter program where boys recruit other boys

September/October

- Attend the School “Open House Nights” or “Back to School Nights”
- Help or recruit help for the fall membership boy talks and school assemblies.
- Conduct a pack membership night for your pack during the Fall Roundup process.
- Turn in your new membership applications at your district’s fall roundup membership rally night.
- Follow-up with unregistered youth from advancement reports and activity rosters.

November

- Follow-up with unregistered youth from advancement reports and activity rosters.
- Follow-up with any youth that may not have been able to make it to pack membership night and called regarding information on joining the Cub Scout Program.
- Follow-up on any applications not in the council office.

December

- Follow-up with unregistered youth from advancement reports and activity rosters.
- Inventory Pack Cub Scout roster against Council’s Chartered Roster.
- Follow-up with any applications not in the council office.

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Monthly Action Items for Pack Growth Coordinators 2006-2007

January

- Review pack plans and goals with pack leadership.
- Attend the Tentative District Pack Growth Coordinator Conference.

February

- Follow-up with unregistered youth from advancement reports and activity rosters.
- Evaluate the need for Tiger Cubs in your pack.

March

- Assist with the “pack lost scout search” for those boys who have dropped out of the pack
- Follow up with unregistered youth from advancement reports and activity rosters
- Discuss with your pack plans for the spring recruitment.
- Recruit members to help with Boy Talks in the schools.

April

- Attend the District “Membership Kickoff” and pick up the Spring Roundup kits for your pack.
- Complete a member/leader inventory of your pack at a committee meeting.
- Conduct a Membership Night for new Tiger Cubs and families.
- Follow-up with unregistered youth from advancement reports and activity rosters.
- Secure dates for your special spring/summer Tiger Cub activity days.

May

- Complete a pack member/leader inventory at your pack committee meeting.
- Under the direction of your pack leadership, work together to select leadership for vacant positions for fall.
- Follow-up with unregistered youth from advancement reports and activity rosters.
- Make sure there is a contact person for all the new recruits for all summer activities.

June/July

- Make sure the membership plan is covered at the Annual Program Planning Conference.
- Follow up with leadership contacts and make sure new recruits are enjoying summer camp experiences and summertime pack activities.
